- Heritage Calgary recently sent you a briefing package on heritage in the city, what we do and how we work with Council. If you didn't get it please let us know.

Heritage Calgary has put together a one stop resource for you to learn about everything you need to know about heritage in Calgary. This includes how sites are added to the Inventory, how municipal heritage designation works, existing incentives and grants and proposed conservation tools and incentives work including the residential tax credit.

What do you know about current heritage matters in the City and within your ward?

I am still learning about the city's inventory overall but believe we have opportunity to increase our heritage assets and knowledge sharing with Calgarians. I think ward 11 buildings and assets are likely on the cusp of heritage designations. It would be good to see some early identification of buildings in Ward 11 which could eventually make it onto the inventory list. It would be worth identifying buildings sooner than later to talk about their upkeep and repair. I think the dam/reservoir could be considered a likely heritage asset as well as the water and utility buildings with some of their key architectural features.

On a scale from 0-5, 0 being not at all and 5 being incredibly, how important is preserving Calgary's heritage to the Ward you hope to serve? Why?

3 - Somewhat important. I selected it based on what I perceive to be the biggest challenges/opportunities in the ward as well as the general age of buildings in ward 11. I think it will become a bigger priority in years to come so it shouldn't be off the radar entirely.

What is your favourite heritage resource in the community you are hoping to represent and in the City of Calgary as a whole?

The dam/reservoir and the water utility buildings adjacent to it.

How are we addressing the heritage of our green spaces and parks including our natural plants, wildlife, and water as part of our story.

Would you like to make any other closing comments pertaining to our city's heritage matters?

I want to know more about heritage but am spinning with things to learn through this election cycle so have admittedly not made it a priority in part because that's not what's being asked by voters in Ward 11.
